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Ways & Means Sub-Committee Report

The Ways & Means Sub-Committee met on Monday, October 24, 2022 at 5:00PM. Committee members present were Councillors Keefe, Novoselsky, Powers, Visconti (ex-officio) and Chairman Rizzo. Councillor Serino was absent. The following item was pending before the Committee:

22-247 `Loan order in the amount of \$29,500,000 for the Wonderland Property Acquisition.

Mayor Arrigo, Attorney John Leonard, and Superintendent Dr. Kelly were present in the Council Chamber and available for questions from the committee.

Councillor Keefe questioned as to why the appraisal company was selected and how close are the company's appraisals are to the actual settled price. Mayor Arrigo responded that the City has done its due diligence in selecting the best people in order to mitigate the risk going into this taking. Attorney Leonard also responded in that Mr. Bob Coleman is the premier appraiser in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and has the best qualifications of anyone. Mr. Coleman was described as a moderate to conservative appraiser and the figure he provided is not an underestimate.

Councillor Morabito asked the City Auditor if the interest rates on the City's debt service scheduled are fixed. Rich Viscay responded that the best rates are based on what the market provides for.

Councillor Powers cited several concerns with the proposed location such as flooding and traffic and sought a commitment from Mayor Arrigo that to mitigate flooding in Ward 5. Mayor Arrigo responded that even when the new high school is built, the City will continue to have the financial capacity to make infrastructure improvements. Dr. Kelly pointed out that the existing

Revere High School site on School Street is dense and currently impacts traffic in a residential neighborhood. The proposed layout for the new high school on Wonderland will be built with roadways around the building that will allow the queuing of vehicles around the school and off the adjacent state roadways.

Council President Visconti questioned the potential cost over and above the bond authorization and if the City should assume that it will be going to court over this matter. President Visconti was also concerned with the City having to make a decision on an unknown factor which is not knowing what the actual settlement which could be \$30 million or more dollars. Attorney Leonard responded that court is possible, but there is a possibility of alternatives such as mediation or arbitration and reiterated that the current owner of the site has not been able to sell the property. Attorney Leonard estimated that the actual cost once settle in court would be around \$45 million. Mayor Arrigo also responded that the biggest risk is not court, but rather not building a school for the students and diverting from the plan which would put the taxpayers at more risk. President Visconti questioned if there was any possibility of building the new high school at the current high school location. Mayor Arrigo responded that there would be significant impacts to student learning if the current high school site was used.

Councillor McKenna asked if the tax revenue generated from the buildout of Suffolk Downs would be used to fund the cost of the new high school and what are the potential legal fees if the City were to litigate the eminent domain taking. Mayor Arrigo responded that not all of the revenue from Suffolk Downs will be spent on the new high school. Attorney Leonard estimated that a fully litigated taking could take 3-4 years at a cost of approximately \$750,000 - \$800,000. However, those estimated fees are not all attorney fees, but rather for the hiring of expert witnesses as this is the most complicated eminent domain taking he has seen in his career.

Councillor Zambuto stated that taking such a large parcel off the tax roles would be the biggest fiscal mistake the City Council could ever make. The potential tax revenue generated from a development on this site would be a huge loss for the City. Additionally, he believes the bond authorization amount should be larger to reflect the potential amount the taking could be settled for.

Councillor Silvestri noted that building a new high school on the site of the current high school is actually more expensive and that now is not the time to block the taking when the City Council has already agreed to this location. He also questioned if all of the land being taken is buildable. Mayor Arrigo responded that not all of the site is buildable and has not generated any revenue in ten years.

Councillor Novoselsky agreed with the City's proposal to construct a new high school at Wonderland and the revenue being spent on the new high school is a good thing. Councillor Novoselsky also stated students already cross American Legion Highway to get to the current high school location and asked if the City would be able to start working on the site once the taking is approved to which Attorney Leonard replied, yes.

Councillor Rizzo questioned as to why old comps from 2015, 2016, and 2017 were used since the market is much different today and that Wonderland was the largest taxpayer in the City at one time. Attorney Leonard replied that for eminent domain takings, sites with buildings cannot be used for comparable sales. Comparable properties must be vacant. Councillor Rizzo then

questioned if the City would need a Proposition 2 ½ Override to fund the cost of the new high school or debt exclusion. Rich Viscay responded that the City would be able to pay for the school without using those mechanisms.

Some committee members wanted to leave the matter in committee for further discussion however, Brian Dakin addressed that the City cannot get on the site for borings and review of other environmental issues which are needed to develop schematic design figures as required by the MSBA. Delaying a vote would delay access to the site.

The committee ultimately decided to vote favorably to recommend approval of the bond authorization as presented. Councillors Keefe, Novoselsky, Powers, and Visconti voting “YES”. Chairman Rizzo voting “NO”. Councillor Serino was absent.

12 22-247 Loan order in the amount of \$29,500,000 for the Wonderland Property Acquisition.

Stephanie Desisto, 7 Reservoir Avenue, Revere, MA addressed the City Council in opposition of the proposed loan order: Ms. Desisto requested the number of parents in the public school system who pay taxes and stated that the highest and best use for the Wonderland property is not a school. She also referenced Lynn Classical which was built on a site in which the pilings sank resulting in litigation.

FURTHER ORDERED: That \$29,500,000 is appropriated to pay costs of said land acquisition project, including the payment of all costs incidental and related thereto; that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7(1) of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the City therefor; and that the Mayor is authorized to take any other action necessary to carry out this project.

FURTHER ORDERED: That the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the appropriate officials of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts (the "Commonwealth") to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds of the City authorized to be borrowed pursuant to this loan order, and to provide such information and execute such documents as such officials of the Commonwealth may require in connection therewith.

**RESOLUTION
MASSDOT ROUTE 1A CORRIDOR**

WHEREAS: Logan International Airport is of economic importance to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and New England Region; and

WHEREAS: The negative impacts from traffic, pollution, and congestion generally are concentrated in the nearby communities to Logan International Airport; and

WHEREAS: The Commonwealth of Massachusetts, through its Department of Transportation, currently owns vacant property located along Route 1A that could be used to reduce pollution and traffic, improve public safety and mitigate community impacts emanating from Logan International Airport and disproportionately harming the residents of the City of Revere; and

WHEREAS: The Massachusetts Department of Transportation has been undertaking a study for more than one year of how to use this vacant land; THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED: That a petition to the Governor of the Commonwealth and Secretary of Transportation of the Commonwealth be issued by the City to request:

1. The repurposing of the abandoned MassDOT property running parallel to Route 1A to provide direct and immediate benefit to the communities in closest proximity to Logan International Airport;
2. The creation of a haul road extension from the current end of the Coughlin Bypass along the abandoned MassDOT property to connect initially to Route 1A at the Revere City Line and then ultimately to Bell Circle thereby creating an alternative means for trucks, buses, and other commercial vehicles to access Logan Airport by avoiding Route 1A and neighborhood streets;
3. The creation of a pedestrian walkway and bike path along the waterfront to enable the communities of Revere, East Boston, and Chelsea to better experience the Chelsea Creek waterfront which has been closed off to us for generations;
4. The construction of barriers, sea walls, and site grading that can be built as part of the transportation and pedestrian improvements thereby furthering the protection of the City of Revere from sea level rise.
5. The transformation of the un-used and neglected piece of Commonwealth property will for the first time provide direct benefit to the City of Revere and lighten the unending burdens placed on its citizens by Logan International Airport.

Several Councillors expressed concern over the cost of the bond authorization and the undue burden that will be placed on the taxpayers. Councillor Rizzo acknowledged that the City does need a new high school, but the figure of \$29,500,000 is not the final figure for the taking as the current property owners will never settle in court for that amount. Councillor Rizzo further cited that students commuting to this location will add to the already congested Butler Circle. Councillor Zambuto cited that the revenue generated over the course of the development of Suffolk Downs was to bring relief to the taxpayers and not for the sole purpose of funding a new high school. Councillor Zambuto also believes that the cost of taking the land could exceed \$100 million dollars. Councillor McKenna stated that she is also concerned over the cost of the taking and referenced Saugus and Winthrop. Both towns were able to build new high schools in recent years on the existing sites of their former high schools.

Councillor Powers indicated that the City needs a new high school and inquired about some of the other empty parcels located on Shawmut Street owned by Wonderland and the City of Revere. Councillor Silvestri is in favor of constructing a new high school. Councillor Keefe who is also a member of the High School Building Committee informed the Council that the planning process for the new high school began prior to Covid and the Building Committee has

met on a regular basis to discuss the site selection. Councillor Keefe stated that one of the major issues with using the existing high school site is the culvert that runs through the property which will be a very costly project to undertake as well.

QUESTION 1: PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

Do you approve of the adoption of an amendment to the constitution summarized below, which was approved by the General Court in joint sessions of the two houses on June 12, 2019 (yeas 147 – nays 48); and again on June 9, 2021 (yeas 159 – nays 41)?

SUMMARY

This proposed constitutional amendment would establish an additional 4% state income tax on that portion of annual taxable income in excess of \$1 million. This income level would be adjusted annually, by the same method used for federal income-tax brackets, to reflect increases in the cost of living. Revenues from this tax would be used, subject to appropriation by the state Legislature, for public education, public colleges and universities; and for the repair and maintenance of roads, bridges, and public transportation. The proposed amendment would apply to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2023.

A YES VOTE would amend the state Constitution to impose an additional 4% tax on that portion of incomes over one million dollars to be used, subject to appropriation by the state Legislature, on education and transportation.

A **NO VOTE** would make no change in the state Constitution relative to income tax.

PREGUNTA 1: ENMIENDA PROPUESTA A LA CONSTITUCIÓN

¿Aprueba la incorporación de una enmienda a la la Constitución, que se resume más abajo, y e recibió la aprobación del Tribunal General de Justicia en sesiones conjuntas de ambas cámaras el 12 de junio de 2019 (afirmativos: 147 - negativos: 48) y, nuevamente, el 9 de junio de 2021 (afirmativos: 159 - negativos: 41)?

RESUMEN

A partir de la enmienda propuesta a la Constitución, se establecería un impuesto estatal adicional del 4 % a los ingresos sobre la parte de los ingresos anuales gravables que superen \$1 millón. Este nivel de ingresos sufriría un ajuste anual (con el mismo método utilizado para los rangos de impuestos sobre los ingresos federales) con el objetivo de reflejar el aumento en el costo de vida. Los ingresos que se obtengan a partir de este impuesto se utilizarían, sujeto a la apropiación de la Legislatura estatal, para la educación pública, facultades y universidades públicas, y para la reparación y el mantenimiento de caminos, puentes y transporte público. La enmienda propuesta se aplicaría a los años fiscales que comiencen a partir del 1 de enero de 2023.

UN VOTO SÍ significaría una enmienda de la Constitución estatal por medio de la cual se impondría un impuesto adicional del 4 % sobre la parte de los ingresos que superen un (1) millón de dólares y cuyo destino sería, sujeto a la apropiación de la Legislatura estatal, la educación y el transporte.

UN VOTO NO no implicaría ningún cambio en la Constitución estatal en lo que respecta al impuesto sobre los ingresos.

QUESTION 2: LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

Do you approve of a law summarized below, on which no vote was taken by the Senate or the House of Representatives on or before May 3, 2022?

SUMMARY

This proposed law would direct the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Division of Insurance to approve or disapprove the rates of dental benefit plans and would require that a dental insurance carrier meet an annual aggregate medical loss ratio for its covered dental benefit plans of 83 percent. The medical loss ratio would measure the amount of premium dollars a dental insurance carrier spends on its members' dental expenses and quality improvements, as opposed to administrative expenses. If a carrier's annual aggregate medical loss ratio is less than 83 percent, the carrier would be required to refund the excess premiums to its covered individuals and groups. The proposed law would allow the Commissioner to waive or adjust the refunds only if it is determined that issuing refunds would result in financial impairment for the carrier.

The proposed law would apply to dental benefit plans regardless of whether they are issued directly by a carrier, through the connector, or through an intermediary. The proposed law would not apply to dental benefit plans issued, delivered, or renewed to a self-insured group or where the carrier is acting as a third-party administrator.

The proposed law would require the carriers offering dental benefit plans to submit information about their current and projected medical loss ratio, administrative expenses, and other financial information to the Commissioner. Each carrier would be required to submit an annual comprehensive financial statement to the Division of Insurance, itemized by market group size and line of business. A carrier that also provides administrative services to one or more self-insured groups would also be required to file an appendix to their annual financial statement with information about its self-insured business. The proposed law would impose a late penalty on a carrier that does not file its annual report on or before April 1.

The Division would be required to make the submitted data public, to issue an annual summary to certain legislative committees, and to exchange the data with the Health Policy Commission. The Commissioner would be required to adopt standards requiring the registration of persons or entities not otherwise licensed or registered by the Commissioner and criteria for the standardized reporting and uniform allocation methodologies among carriers.

The proposed law would allow the Commissioner to approve dental benefit policies for the purpose of being offered to individuals or groups. The Commissioner would be required to adopt regulations to determine eligibility criteria.

The proposed law would require carriers to file group product base rates and any changes to group rating factors that are to be effective on January 1 of each year on or before July 1 of the preceding year. The Commissioner would be required to disapprove any proposed changes to base rates that are excessive, inadequate, or unreasonable in relation to the benefits charged. The Commissioner would also be required to disapprove any change to group rating factors that is discriminatory or not actuarially sound.

The proposed law sets forth criteria that, if met, would require the Commissioner to presumptively disapprove a carrier's rate, including if the aggregate medical loss ratio for all dental benefit plans offered by a carrier is less than 83 percent.

The proposed law would establish procedures to be followed if a proposed rate is presumptively disapproved or if the Commissioner disapproves a rate.

The proposed law would require the Division to hold a hearing if a carrier reports a risk-based capital ratio on a combined entity basis that exceeds 700 percent in its annual report.

The proposed law would require the Commissioner to promulgate regulations consistent with its provisions by October 1, 2023. The proposed law would apply to all dental benefit plans issued, made effective, delivered, or renewed on or after January 1, 2024.

A YES VOTE would regulate dental insurance rates, including by requiring companies to spend at least 83% of premiums on member dental expenses and quality improvements instead of administrative expenses, and by making other changes to dental insurance regulations.

A NO VOTE would make no change in the law relative to the regulations that apply to dental insurance companies.

PREGUNTA 2: LEY PROPUESTA POR UNA PETICIÓN DE INICIATIVA

¿Aprueba la ley que se sintetiza más abajo, respecto de la cual el Senado o la Cámara de Representantes adoptó un voto por “No” antes del 3 de mayo de 2022, inclusive?

RESUMEN

Bajo la ley propuesta, se instruiría al Comisionado de la División de Seguros de Massachusetts a aprobar o desaprobar las tarifas de los planes de beneficios dentales, en tanto que se exigiría que un proveedor de seguro dental se ajuste a un índice de pérdida médica acumulada anual del 83 % en lo que respecta a sus planes de beneficios dentales cubiertos. Con el índice de pérdida médica, se mediría el monto de dólares de prima que destina un proveedor de seguro dental a los gastos dentales de sus miembros y a mejoras en la calidad, en contraposición a los gastos administrativos. En caso de que el índice de pérdida médica acumulada anual del proveedor sea inferior al 83 %, se requeriría que el proveedor reembolse las primas excedentes a sus personas y grupos con cobertura. Bajo la ley propuesta, se permitiría que el Comisionado renuncie a los fondos, o los ajuste, únicamente en caso de que se determine que el hecho de emitir reembolsos tendría como resultado una desventaja económica para el proveedor.

La ley propuesta se aplicaría a los planes de beneficios dentales, independientemente de si los emite directamente un proveedor, lo realiza a través del conector, o por medio de un intermediario. La ley propuesta no aplicaría a los planes de beneficios dentales emitidos, entregados o renovados a un grupo autoasegurado o toda vez que el proveedor actúe en carácter de administrador externo.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se exige que los proveedores que ofrecen planes de beneficios dentales envíen información sobre su índice de pérdida médica, tanto proyectado como actual, gastos administrativos y otro tipo de información financiera al Comisionado. Se exigiría que cada proveedor envíe una declaración financiera anual e integral a la División de Seguros, detallada según el tamaño del grupo del mercado y la línea de negocios. Asimismo, se exigiría que un proveedor que también ofrece servicios administrativos a uno o más grupos autoasegurados presente un anexo junto con su declaración

financiera anual con información sobre el negocio autoasegurado. Bajo la ley propuesta, se impondría una penalidad tardía sobre todo proveedor que no presente su informe anual antes del 1 de abril, o en esa fecha.

Se requeriría que la División publique los datos enviados, emita un resumen anual para ser presentado ante ciertos comités legislativos e intercambie datos con la Comisión de Políticas de Salud. Se requeriría que el Comisionado adopte estándares que requieran del registro de personas o entidades que, de algún otro modo, no cuentan con licencia, o bien, no están registradas por el Comisionado, y criterios para la elaboración y presentación estandarizadas de informes, y para la asignación uniforme de metodologías entre los proveedores.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se permitiría que el Comisionado apruebe políticas de beneficios dentales a los efectos de ofrecerse a personas o grupos. Se requeriría que el Comisionado adopte regulaciones para determinar los criterios de elegibilidad.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se exigiría que los proveedores presenten tarifas base para grupos de productos y los cambios en los factores de calificación grupal que entrarán en vigencia el 1 de enero de cada año o antes del 1 de julio del año anterior. Se requeriría que el Comisionado desaprobe cualquiera de los cambios propuestos en las tarifas base que se consideren excesivos, inadecuados o irrazonables en relación con los beneficios cobrados. Asimismo, se requeriría que el Comisionado desaprobe cualquier tipo de cambio que tenga lugar en los factores de clasificación grupal que sea discriminatorio o no sea lógico a nivel actuarial.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se establecen ciertos criterios que, en caso de cumplirse, requerirían que el Comisionado desaprobe, en forma presunta, la tarifa de un proveedor, incluido si el índice de pérdida médica acumulada para todos los planes de beneficios dentales que ofrece un proveedor sea inferior al 83 %.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se establecerían procedimientos a seguir en caso de que la tarifa propuesta se desaprobe presuntamente, o bien, si el Comisionado desaprobe una tarifa.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se exigiría que la División lleve a cabo una audiencia en caso de que un proveedor informe un índice de capital basado en el riesgo bajo el fundamento de entidad combinada que supere el 700 % en su informe anual.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se exigiría que el Comisionado promulgue regulaciones en consonancia con las disposiciones para del 1 de octubre de 2023. La ley propuesta se aplicaría a todos los planes de beneficios dentales que entren en vigor, se entreguen o renueven a partir del 1 de enero de 2024, inclusive.

UN VOTO SÍ se regularían las tarifas de seguros dentales, incluso al exigir que las compañías destinen, como mínimo, el 83 % de las primas a gastos dentales de los miembros y mejoras en la calidad, en lugar de hacerlo a gastos administrativos, y al implementar otros cambios en las regulaciones de seguros dentales.

UN VOTO NO no se aplicarían cambios en la ley relacionada con las regulaciones que rigen para las compañías de seguros dentales.

QUESTION 3: LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

Do you approve of a law summarized below, on which no vote was taken by the Senate or the House of Representatives on or before May 3, 2022?

SUMMARY

This proposed law would increase the statewide limits on the combined number of licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption (including licenses for “all alcoholic beverages” and for “wines and malt beverages”) that any one retailer could own or control: from 9 to 12 licenses in 2023; to 15 licenses in 2027; and to 18 licenses in 2031.

Beginning in 2023, the proposed law would set a maximum number of “all alcoholic beverages” licenses that any one retailer could own or control at 7 licenses unless a retailer currently holds more than 7 such licenses.

The proposed law would require retailers to conduct the sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption through

face-to-face transactions and would prohibit automated or self-checkout sales of alcoholic beverages by such retailers.

The proposed law would alter the calculation of the fine that the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission may accept in lieu of suspending any license issued under the State Liquor Control Act. The proposed law would modify the formula for calculating such fee from being based on the gross profits on the sale of alcoholic beverages to being based on the gross profits on all retail sales.

The proposed law would also add out-of-state motor vehicle licenses to the list of the forms of identification that any holder of a license issued under the State Liquor Control Act, or their agent or employee, may choose to reasonably rely on for proof of a person's identity and age.

A YES VOTE would increase the number of licenses a retailer could have for the sale of alcoholic beverages to be consumed off premises, limit the number of “all-alcoholic beverages” licenses that a retailer could acquire, restrict use of self-checkout, and require retailers to accept customers’ out-of-state identification.

A NO VOTE would make no change in the laws governing the retail sale of alcoholic beverages.

PREGUNTA 3: LEY PROPUESTA POR UNA PETICIÓN DE INICIATIVA

¿Aprueba la ley que se sintetiza más abajo, respecto de la cual el Senado o la Cámara de Representantes adoptó un voto por “No” antes del 3 de mayo de 2022, inclusive?

RESUMEN

Bajo la ley propuesta, se incrementarían los límites estatales respecto de la cantidad combinada de licencias destinadas a la venta de bebidas alcohólicas para consumo fuera de las instalaciones (incluidas las licencias para “todas las bebidas alcohólicas” y para “vinos y bebidas con malta”) que podría tener un solo minorista bajo su control y propiedad: de 9 a 12 licencias en 2023; a 15 licencias en 2027, y a 18 licencias en 2031.

A partir de 2023, según la ley propuesta, se establecería en siete (7) la cantidad máxima de licencias para “todas las bebidas alcohólicas” que podría tener un solo minorista bajo su control o propiedad, excepto que un minorista actualmente tenga más de 7 de dichas licencias.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se requeriría que los minoristas realicen las ventas de bebidas alcohólicas para consumo fuera de las instalaciones por medio de transacciones presenciales, en tanto que se prohibirían las ventas automatizadas o con cajas de autoservicio de bebidas alcohólicas por parte de dichos minoristas.

Bajo la ley propuesta, se modificaría el cálculo de la multa que podría aceptar la Comisión de Control de Bebidas Alcohólicas en lugar de suspender cualquier tipo de licencia emitida de conformidad con la Ley Estatal de Control de Bebidas Alcohólicas. Bajo la ley propuesta, se modificaría la fórmula para calcular dicha tarifa y pasar de basarse en las ganancias brutas derivadas de la venta de bebidas alcohólicas a basarse en las ganancias brutas de todas las ventas minoristas.

Bajo la ley propuesta, también se agregarían las licencias de vehículos motorizados ajenos al estado a la lista de formas de identificación que cualquier titular de una licencia emitida en virtud de la Ley Estatal de Control de Bebidas Alcohólicas, o su agente o empleado, podría elegir como prueba razonable de la identidad y la edad de una persona.

UN VOTO SÍ se incrementarían la cantidad de licencias que podría tener un minorista para la venta de bebidas alcohólicas para consumo fuera de las instalaciones, se limitaría la cantidad de “bebidas totalmente alcohólicas” que podría adquirir un minorista, se restringiría el uso de cajas de autoservicio, y se exigiría que los minoristas acepten identificaciones de los clientes ajenas al estado.

UN VOTO NO no se aplicarían cambios en las leyes que regulan la venta minorista de bebidas alcohólicas.

QUESTION 4: REFERENDUM ON AN EXISTING LAW

Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was approved by the House of Representatives and the Senate on May 26, 2022?

SUMMARY

This law allows Massachusetts residents who cannot provide proof of lawful presence in the United States to obtain a standard driver's license or learner's permit if they meet all the other qualifications for a standard license or learner's permit, including a road test and insurance, and provide proof of their identity, date of birth, and residency. The law provides that, when processing an application for such a license or learner's permit or motor vehicle registration, the registrar of motor vehicles may not ask about or create a record of the citizenship or immigration status of the applicant, except as otherwise required by law. This law does not allow people who cannot provide proof of lawful presence in the United States to obtain a REAL ID.

To prove identity and date of birth, the law requires an applicant to present at least two documents, one from each of the following categories: (1) a valid unexpired foreign passport or a valid unexpired Consular Identification document; and (2) a valid unexpired driver's license from any United States state or territory, an original or certified copy of a birth certificate, a valid unexpired foreign national identification card, a valid unexpired foreign driver's license, or a marriage certificate or divorce decree issued by any state or territory of the United States. One of the documents presented by an applicant must include a photograph and one must include a date of birth. Any documents not in English must be accompanied by a certified translation. The registrar may review any documents issued by another country to determine whether they may be used as proof of identity or date of birth.

The law requires that applicants for a driver's license or learner's permit shall attest, under the pains and penalties of perjury, that their license has not been suspended or revoked in any other state, country, or jurisdiction.

The law specifies that information provided by or relating to any applicant or license-holder will not be a public record and shall not be disclosed, except as required by federal law or as authorized by Attorney General regulations, and except for purposes of motor vehicle insurance.

The law directs the registrar of motor vehicles to make regulations regarding the documents required of United States citizens and others who provide proof of lawful presence with their license application.

The law also requires the registrar and the Secretary of the Commonwealth to establish procedures and regulations to ensure that an applicant for a standard driver's license or learner's permit who does not provide proof of lawful presence will not be automatically registered to vote.

The law takes effect on July 1, 2023.

A YES VOTE would keep in place the law, which would allow Massachusetts residents who cannot provide proof of lawful presence in the United States to obtain a driver's license or permit if they meet the other requirements for doing so.

A NO VOTE would repeal this law.

PREGUNTA 4: REFERÉNDUM SOBRE UNA LEY EXISTENTE

RESUMEN

Esta ley permite a todos los residentes de Massachusetts que no puedan brindar prueba de presencia legal en los Estados Unidos obtener una licencia de conducir o un permiso de aprendiz estándares si reúnen todos los requisitos para solicitar una licencia de conducir o un permiso de aprendiz estándares, incluida una prueba en carretera y un seguro, y que presenten una prueba de su identidad, fecha de nacimiento y residencia. La ley estipula que, cuando se procese una

solicitud para la licencia o el permiso de aprendiz mencionados o para registrar un vehículo a motor, el registrador de los vehículos a motor no realizará preguntas ni creará un registro sobre el estado de ciudadanía o inmigración del solicitante, excepto que así lo requiera la ley. Esta ley no permite que las personas que no puedan brindar prueba de presencia legal en los Estados Unidos obtengan una IDENTIFICACIÓN REAL.

Para probar la identidad y la fecha de nacimiento, la ley exige que el solicitante presente como mínimo dos documentos, uno Para probar la identidad y la fecha de nacimiento, la ley exige que el solicitante presente como mínimo dos documentos, uno de cada una de las siguientes categorías: (1) un pasaporte extranjero válido y que no haya vencido o un documento de Identificación Consular válido y que no haya vencido; y (2) una licencia de conducir válida y que no haya vencido de cualquiera de los estados o territorios de los Estados Unidos, el original o una copia del certificado de nacimiento, una tarjeta de identificación nacional extranjera válida y que no haya vencido, una licencia de conducir extranjera válida y que no haya vencido o un certificado de casamiento o una sentencia de divorcio emitida por cualquier estado o territorio de los Estados Unidos. Uno de los documentos que presente el solicitante debe incluir una fotografía y uno debe incluir la fecha de nacimiento. Cualquier documento que no esté en idioma inglés debe estar acompañado por una traducción certificada. El registrador puede revisar todos los documentos emitidos por otro país para determinar si se pueden usar como prueba de identidad o de la fecha de nacimiento.

La ley exige que los solicitantes de una licencia de conducir o de un permiso de aprendiz certifiquen, bajo apercibimiento de ley, que su licencia no fue suspendida ni anulada en ningún otro estado, país o jurisdicción.

La ley especifica que la información que proporcione un solicitante o titular de la licencia o esté relacionada con dicha persona no será un registro público y no se divulgará, excepto que así lo requiera la ley federal o que esté autorizado por disposiciones de un Fiscal General, y salvo a efectos del seguro del vehículo a motor.

La ley instruye al registrante de los vehículos a motor a cumplir con las disposiciones en relación a los documentos requeridos a ciudadanos de los Estados Unidos y a otras personas que brinden una prueba de presencia legal junto con su solicitud de la licencia.

La ley también requiere que el registrante y el Secretario de la Mancomunidad establezcan los procedimientos y las disposiciones para garantizar que un solicitante de una licencia de conducir o permiso de aprendizaje estándares que no brinde prueba de presencia legal no sea registrado automáticamente para votar.

La ley entra en vigencia el 1.º de julio de 2023.

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN

LOCAL 880**

It is agreed by and between the City of Revere and Revere Public Works Department Union, AFSCME Council 93, Local 880 that the terms of the collective bargaining agreement covering the period from July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2021, shall be extended from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2024, except as modified by the following paragraphs:

The City agrees to raise the base pay of all members as follows:

July 1, 2021	-	3%
July 1, 2022	-	3%
July 1, 2023	-	3%

Article 4.2 c) MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

Add the following words to the end of paragraph c): "This shall include adding GPS to any and all City vehicles; changes to City uniform requirements at the City's sole discretion, including safety clothing requirements; changes to time and attendance requirements, including the elimination of the punch clock and utilizing an automated system through the City's payroll and financial software. A member of Local 880 will be added to the implementation committee that is currently formed for the time and attendance changes.

Article 6.1.1 – HOURS OF WORK shall be amended as follows

- a) Day Shift - Monday to Friday: 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; with one 15-minute break in the morning and a 30-minute break for lunch and no afternoon break.

Article 7.1 – HOLIDAYS – shall be amended to include Juneteenth and delete the words "floating holidays" and replace with the words "personal days."

Article 8.2.6 – (second paragraph -VACATIONS) – shall be amended to add the words: "Allowed to carry three (3) weeks of vacation per year at end of year." The remainder shall remain the same.

Article 10.3 – Death in the Immediate Family shall be amended to include 3 days of bereavement leave in the event of the death of a brother-in-law, sister-in-law, or grandchild.

Article 12.1 Clothing Allowance shall be increased, effective 7/1/2022, from \$1,100.00 to \$1,200.00 in two equal cash payments of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) which shall be paid in equal installments in December and June, respectively, each year, subject to twelve (12) months of service.



Article 14.5 –CDL shall be amended to increase, effective 7/1/2022, the differential from \$1.10 to \$1.50 per hour. Employees receiving such a differential are required to provide proof of licensure to the Revere Human Resources Department.

Primary Hoist Operators shall be required to maintain a CDL.

All employees maintaining an active CDL license shall also be elevated to Craftsman level pay, effective as of the signing of the contract.

The City will pay for all licenses and fees associated with maintaining a hoisting license.

Any employee receiving CDL stipend and/or elevation to Craftsman level pay for maintaining a CDL license. Employees are required to report the loss or any compromise of such CDL license, whether by suspension, revocation, expiration, or otherwise, to his/her immediate supervisor and the HR Department on the date the employee is made aware of that information. In such event, the CDL differential shall be immediately withheld until reinstated.

STIPENDS

The following stipends shall be added:

On-Call (General Side) Elimination of the \$5,200 on call stipend and replace with \$250 weekly stipend to one DPW employee on a rotating basis by seniority. Employees being called in will be paid a four (4) hour minimum for said recall. Employees will be called in by department, based upon the work needed to be performed, then by order of the on-call list if no response within 15 minutes of initial call to the respective department employees. The Superintendent of Public Works will also be notified upon the need of any on-call work needed. A four (4) -hour minimum shall apply to all employees being called to perform said duties.

Primary Hoist Operator – effective 7/1/2022

There will be up to three (3) primary hoist operators on the DPW side and up to three (3) primary hoist operators on the WSD side, as determined by the DPW Superintendent and Chief of Infrastructure, respectively. Each primary hoist operator will be entitled to a stipend of \$3,000 per year, payable in December and June of each fiscal year. Prorated stipends will be on a monthly basis if needed.

Concrete Finisher Stipends: - deferred until a mutually agreed upon policy/certification is presented to all parties for review within 90 days of the signing and a favorable vote of the membership.

Elections

Effective July 1, 2022, a \$500.00 additional payment will be made to each employee, up to six employees total, working a City-wide election, which must include Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday (assuming elections occur on Tuesdays). It is up to Management and the Elections Commission to determine how many employees may be needed based on the type of election.



Barrel Inventory Control Officer

The City will create a foreman position for the duties of Barrel Inventory Control Officer. This job will be posted once a complete description of the job and its duties have been mutually agreed upon by the Superintendent of DPW, HR Director, and Union.

Carpentry/Paint Department

The City will create a new subdivision of the Facilities Maintenance Department that will include a "Carpentry/Paint Department. This department will be made up of one (1) foreman and at least one (1) laborer/craftsman. These positions will be posted once a complete description of the job and its duties have been mutually agreed upon by the Superintendent of DPW, HR Director, and Union.

Water Sewer Division

Tanker License - \$1,500.00 per year for any employee who has a tanker license/endorsement. If an employee is asked to perform duties associated with having a tanker license and cannot/will not perform such duties, the City shall revoke said stipend immediately.

Water Licenses:

- DW-DA and DW-D1 (formerly Class 1): \$2,500.00 per year;
- DW-DB and DW-D2 (formerly Class 2): \$5,000.00 per year;
- DW-DC and DW-D3 (formerly Class 3): \$7,500.00 per year;

Employee(s) are responsible for payment for any training regarding above water licenses. The City will compensate employees who need to attend classes during normal working hours as agreed upon within this Memorandum of Agreement (MoA). All licensure stipends will commence once proof of licensure has been submitted to the Chief of Infrastructure (or his/her designee) and the Director of Human Resources.

On-Call – Water Division – upon ratification:

\$400 per week for up to two employees, including all Dig Safe calls.

NOTE: Call-ins shall receive a two (2) hour minimum for Dig Safe calls, and a four (4) hour minimum for water break calls. This provision voids all previous Dig Safe and on-call agreements in prior MoA's.

Miscellaneous

1. The General Foreman position shall be removed from the union (AFSCME), and each member shall receive \$.50/hour increase to their base pay effective as of the signing of this MoA. This \$.50/hour increase will become effective after any retroactive base increases for FY2021 and FY2022.
2. New hires as of the signing of this MoA shall receive pay and benefits pursuant to the collective bargaining agreement but shall have a probationary period of 12 months and shall not have the right to grieve and neither the employee nor the Union may not demand



arbitration emanating from the termination of such probationary period for any reason, including a determination of unsuitability for the work, during that period.

- 3. The position(s) of Senior Supervisor in any DPW/WSD department shall be eliminated/red-lined upon that position being vacated by its current occupant(s).
- 4. Safety and Fleetio Stipends to be removed from the union (AFSCME) as of the signing of this MoA.
- 5. The AFSCME positions of Lead Supervisor will be posted (one (1) for DPW and one (1) for WSD) once a job description is completed and agreed upon by both the City and the Union. This will be completed and posted within 60 days of the signing and a favorable vote of the membership.

Clean Slate

The parties agree that, upon execution of this Agreement, all pending matters will be withdrawn.

This MoA is subject to ratification of Union membership and appropriation of funding by the City Council. Upon the successful conclusion of negotiations, the parties agree to produce a Memorandum of Agreement which shall be integrated into a CBA within ninety (90) days of ratification.




